I have been on several patch walks with Rutland Community Safety Melody Ismail and Hugh Crouch looking at Improving and installing further CCTV around Uppingham along with speaking to local residents around The Quadrant and Wilkes garden's discussing drug use.

Local housing partners Long Hurst and Platform housing group have also been working with us to deal with drug use from their tenants and reviews of their tenancies.

PSCO Wylie and I have held 3 community beat surgeries this month in 3 different locations, Uppingham Library, Welland Vale Garden Center and lastly the Community fridge at the Town Hall.

Further Engagement has been with all public house owners, working together to build intelligence and to educate members of the public around their safety with drinking and driving.

We continue to engage with the youth playing and using Tod's Piece, which has resulted in kind words being received from the Local residents along Tod's Terrace expressing their thanks as they have seen a difference in how the local youths are conducting themselves whilst out and about.
