Roll Call of Organisations and Residents

43 attendees were recorded as being present. Attendees were advised that the meeting was to be recorded and photographed at some point in the evening.

1. Chair's Welcome and Opening Remarks

Welcome everyone, I am Janet Thompson the Chair of the Forum, a special welcome to anyone who is attending for the first time. People who have attended before will know I like to start with a little light heartedness....

You must use the microphone otherwise the rest of the audience will not be able to hear you and I may have to move on to someone else. So raise your hand if you wish to ask a question and WAIT for the microphone before speaking. Please make your questions succinct and to the point so that we can cover as much as possible during the evening.

The minutes of this meeting will be available on the Uppingham First website in due course and to assist with this we will be recording the session. We have guests from our Police Force and our GP Surgery and VAR, I will introduce them as we go along. You will hopefully all have received our August Newsletter which details lots of amazing things going on in Uppingham.

All the members of the Forum and Uppingham First are volunteers and give up their time to assist our lovely town and the residents. I am not politically motivated and I have no hidden agenda...just the one you have on your seats.

I wanted to drawer your attention to Neighbourhood Watch which is supported by the Police, in their recent newsletter there is a very good article on 'standing up to street harassment and the impact of crime. You can download an app called 'Help me Angela' for your personal safety and it can track your GPS location if you are in danger. I bring this up because you may have children or grandchildren embarking on university life and it could give them some reassurance as they venture forward.

Also look out for the RALSS- Rutland Adult Learning Social Servies who are running multiple courses at Ashwell. These include courses for adults on Maths, crafts, sewing and cooking. Please let others who may benefit from these courses know. They are subsidised by the County Council and some are even free to those who are eligible.

You will have seen from the Newsletter that a Defibrillator has now been installed in Wisteria House, thanks to Tom Johnston, Mark Shaw and Uppingham First. I have to admit I had presumed that all Care Homes would have a defib installed, but it appears not. I even checked on my own mother's care home in Worcestershire and they didn't have one.

There are a lot of events going on for the rest of the year, some of them are noted in our newsletter, and on the agenda you have already. There is also the Rutland Round Classic Car Rally on Sunday 3rd September starting in the Market Square; take a look.The Ride & Stride is on Saturday 9th September which allows you to walk or cycle to as many churches as you wish in Rutland and helps to raise funds for the individual churches and the Churches Conservation Trust.

So we will get on with section 2 of tonight's agenda...which is me again."

2. Executive Committee AGM Report

Janet reported on the key decisions taken at the UNF Executive Committee AGM which had met immediately prior to the public meeting. These were:-

- Annual Report, Accounts and Financial Update The draft 2023 Annual Report was approved for publication subject to the Executive appointing the named nominees and officers later in the meeting. It was acknowledged that the Forum no longer had its own bank account, but instead had a ring fenced budget heading in the Uppingham First accounts. This avoided Forum bank charges and insurance costs. The provision of administrative and banking support for the Forum by Uppingham First for the future was approved. The UF accounts and budget statement were noted and received.
- Nominations and Elections The following were unanimously approved:-

- c) Neighbourhood Plan Advisory Group (NPAG) Janet Thompson BEM and Andrew Mankowski
- d) Forum Coordinator 23/24 Ron Simpson BEM
- **Uppingham Emergency Plan Update** It was agreed that this be delayed to enable the incorporation of learning from the forthcoming Flood Management event being offered by the Leicester, Leicestershire and Rutland Resilience Forum. Mark Shaw and Ron Simpson BEM are attending.
- Neighbourhood Watch The need for residents to now signup online, as recommended by the police, was noted as was the continuation of the Uppingham schemes under the UppWatch banner. It was agreed to confirm that our Uppingham schemes still benefitted from membership of the national N W association, given the current effort to restart an association in Leicestershire.
- Data Management and Safeguarding Polices The committee noted the need to revisit these policies even if no change was required. It was agreed that both be readopted for 2023/24. The need for an updated Equality and Diversity Policy was acknowledged.

3. Crime and Policing Update

Uppingham Beat Officer PC 1668 Rebecca Angel supported by an onscreen presentation of the crime statistics for May, June and July 2023 led members of the public through a dialogue on the current policing issues in Uppingham. 4. Health and Wellbeing – Uppingham Surgery

Daniel Medhurst, Operations Manager at Uppingham Surgery led members of the public through recent developments at the surgery and in particular the new surgery website. With live online access to the site on screen, Daniel demonstrated much of the site's capability and answered questions from the floor.

6. Voluntary Action Rutland (VAR)

Chief Executive Officer of VAR, Tom Watson, provided an update on the new location of his organisation and the range of services offered by VAR, in particular its very well regarded transport scheme. Tom confirmed the excellent working relationship between the Uppingham Hopper project and the VAR transport team. There was mutual benefit in such a collaborative approach. Tom distributed literature on VAR services and welcomed the invitation to speak and take questions.

7. Planning Update

Deputy Mayor David Ainslie BEM provided the meeting with a short update on the timetable for both the new Local Plan and the new Uppingham Neighbourhood Plan. It is expected that both will be approved for the next stage of publication by the October meeting of RCC Cabinet with the next stages of public consultation commencing soon after.

8. Community Group Updates

Meeting attendees attention was again drawn to the events listed in the latest UNF Newsletter and both Ride and Stride and the Round Rutland Run classic car events
