# **Uppingham Community Emergency Plan**

# Notes of a Virtual Meeting of UppWatch Volunteers held on Sunday April 12th 2020 at 4pm

#### 1. Online Roll Call

Twenty four volunteers were visually confirmed as present online with the meeting being led by Janet Thompson, Chair of the Uppingham Neighbourhood Forum. Janet invited volunteers to introduce themselves and any organisational roles they played in the community. It was noted that, in addition to volunteer residents, members and/or representatives of the following organisations were present:- RCC, UTC, Uppingham Neighbourhood Forum, Uppingham Lodge, UppWatch, Uppingham Church, the Hopper Heroes, Uppingham First, Uppingham Community Emergency Plan Coordinators, Uppingham Patient Participation Group, Uppingham Community Land Trust, Beeches Residents Association, Limes, Rotary, Firs and Spurs Residents Association and UppWatch.

## 2. Uppingham Support Structures

An updated overview of the town's support, governance and volunteer structures (including the Uppingham Hopper) is attached (See Appendix A). It was noted that 35 volunteers were now on call for support with shopping etc. It was acknowledged that a significant number of other residents were supporting their friends and neighbours at this difficult time. A number of UppWatch volunteers are also acting as NHS volunteers.

### 3. Discussion

The following issues were raised:-

- a) The RCC Crisis Line number was confirmed as 01572 729603 staffed 9am to 8pm
- b) County Cllr Lucy Stephenson updated the meeting about the making of circa 500 bandanas for the nurses at Glenfield Hospital(they help protect the ears of NHS staff and others having to wear masks)
- c) Lucy Stephenson also outlined her 'Phone Pals' project to be run in collaboration with the Uppingham Neighbourhood Forum. A number of volunteers have already offered support. Letters were delivered earlier in the day to residents of Gerard Court, Bonnar and Taylor Houses. See Appendices A and B.
- d) David Ainslie provided an update on the re-tasking of the Uppingham Hopper (20 medicine deliveries and 12 vegetable boxes this week)
- e) Safeguarding and recognition as a volunteer by clients, shops and the police UppWatch letters of accreditation are being issued to all volunteers when undertaking their first shop. Most volunteers were offering repeat support directly once a relationship with a new client had been established
- f) Town Councillor Liz Clark is leading on the production of medical scrubs. Donations of suitable fabric welcomed. Please contact Liz on 07702 563211 or e-mail Janet at <a href="mailto:janetthompson169@gmail.com">janetthompson169@gmail.com</a>

- h) NHS national list of the most vulnerable It was noted that details were not being shared, raising concerns about the possibility of some of the vulnerable slipping through the support net
- i) UppWatch Resilience The possibility of some volunteers having to stand down in the future for health or personal reasons will require the 'handing on' of relevant information
